The Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) enforces regulations in order to protect the health and care of animals, plants, and agricultural industry. Violations of these regulations jeopardize the animal and plant health systems that are vital to protect American agriculture.

Our investigation shows that you have violated Federal Regulations as described on the enclosed Civil Penalty Stipulation Agreement form. APHIS laws and regulations provide for administrative and criminal penalties to enforce these regulatory requirements. The amount of the monetary penalty, or possible criminal charges, depends on the number and severity of the violations.

The Secretary of Agriculture may assess a civil penalty for such violations after notice and an opportunity for a hearing. However, you may waive your right to a hearing and settle this matter by paying \$4,600 and signing the agreement form. You may voluntarily accept this reduced agreement to avoid further action.

Please pay the civil penalty by certified check or money order made payable to the Treasurer of the United States. Write the Case Number (CA05047-AC) on your check or money order and mail it with the signed agreement form to:

If we do not receive your signed stipulation agreement and payment within 30 days, we will seek higher civil or criminal penalties for each violation. You may contact our office at telephone number (301) 734-8684 if you have any questions.

	2.31(d)(1)(viii)	approved treatment regimens. Failed to have the staff adequately trained to handle rabbits and perform procedures.
	2.31(e)(1)	Made significant change in the numbers of rabbits used for the production of antibodies. The protocol authorized the use of 80 rabbits; and at the time of the inspection, 1,024 rabbits were being used.
	2.31(e)(2)	Made significant change in an ongoing activity without providing rationale in the protocol that addresses the appropriateness of the number of animals being used. The rationale for using large animals was contradicted y the use of large numbers of small animals.
	2.33(a)(2)	Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care. Failed to follow the recommended treatment of the veterinarian. Bleed Report, dated 9-27-04, shows that blood was collected from an animal
	2.33(b)(2)	after veterinarian recommended ceasing blood collection. There was no record for treatment of lesions on animal E4, and animal 431 had low hematocrit. There was no record that the veterinarian was contacted for approximately 90 days. Animal #713 was repeatedly used for blood and plasma production after low hematocrit was found.
	2.33(b)(4) 3.56(a)(1)	Used unapproved forms of euthanasia (procaine penicillin and gunshot). Cleaning of primary enclosures. Several rabbit cages contained areas with caked feces and hair.
