# Safety Planning for Pets

for domestic violence survivors and their pets, provided by Safe Havens for Pets and the Animal Welfare Institute

## IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY, DIAL 911

### **ALWAYS:**

- Have emergency provisions for your pet in case your abuser withholds money
- Keep the number of the nearest 24 hour emergency veterinary clinic on-hand

#### IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO LEAVE:

- Establish ownership of your pet by creating a paper trail (e.g. obtain a license, have veterinarian records put in your name)
- Obtain safe, confidential shelter for your pet (e.g. veterinarian, friend, family, a <a href="Safe Haven for Pets">Safe Haven for Pets</a> program)
- Pack a bag for your pet that includes:

O Food O Toy

O Medication(s) O Bedding

O Veterinary records O Documents of

O Collar and leash ownership (vet

O ID and rabies tags records, licenses, etc.)

O Carrier

### IF YOU HAVE ALREADY LEFT:

- Change your veterinarian and pet care providers
- Keep pets indoors (if possible)
- Supervise your pet when they are outdoors
- Avoid public parks/dog parks
- Think carefully about where and when you walk your pet, and do not walk your pet alone
